1976 Program of Field Trips

Only series subscribers to the Speakers Program may purchase tickets for the Field Trips, which are conducted on a Tuesday or a Wednesday schedule the week following each discussion. A tour ticket is valid only on the date for which the ticket is issued, and must be presented for admission. There are no refunds on field trip tickets, and no replacement of lost tickets can be made. The price of each tour is \$9.00. Luncheon (gratuity included) is provided on all tours. Tours depart from and return to the Clinton Street (west) Entrance to the Chicago & North Western Station. Tours operate on closely coordinated schedules, and the departure of buses cannot be delayed for late-comers. Comfortable shoes are recommended. Since program arrangements must be made many months in advance, scheduled events may sometimes be subject to change. Please read carefully the instructions on How to Order Tickets.

Tour One Tuesday, Sept. 14 • Wednesday, Sept. 15 Depart promptly at 8:30 a.m. to visit a hog and a cattle feed lot type farms in Kane County. En route, the directors of the farm bureaus of Kane, McHenry and DuPage counties will present an introduction to farming. At the Gould farm, you will see the growth stages of 2,000 hogs from piglets to porkers. Our host farmers and their wives will join us for a pork barbecue luncheon. In the afternoon, we will visit the Konen farm where approximately 1,000 steers are fattened for market. We will explore with Mr. Konen the sophisticated process of feed lot management. We will also view the necessary farm machinery. The buses will return to North Western station approximately 3:45 p.m.

Note: Dress appropriately—country clothes, please.

Tour Two Tuesday, Sept. 28 • Wednesday, Sept. 29 Departing at 9:00 a.m. for Brookfield Zoo and arriving at the north gate (31st St.) at 9:30. Dr. George Rabb, curators and animal keepers will speak to us at various exhibits emphasizing the studies of animal behavior, zoo construction and human education. Transportation will be on the Zoo Motor Safari. Luncheon will be at the Safari Lodge and will be followed by a special show at the Seven Seas where the dolphins will perform. Please wear walking shoes and bring a raincoat. Return to North Western Station by 3:30.

Tour Three Tuesday, Oct. 12 • Wednesday, Oct. 13 Departing promptly at 9:00 a.m.; arriving 9:20 at Prentice Women's Hospital and Maternity Center (333 E. Superior). The tour will be divided into two groups. Group I will visit the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago for slide presentation and tour of the facilities. Group II will tour Prentice Women's Hospital and Maternity Center and the Institute of Psychiatry. Lunch at the Lake Shore Club of Chicago with a doctor or head nurse from one of the three hospitals at each table to answer questions. In the afternoon, Group I will visit Prentice and the Institute of Psychiatry, and Group II will proceed to the Rehabilitation Institute. Return to North Western Station by 3:30.

Tour Four Tuesday, Oct. 26 • Wednesday, Oct. 27 Early Bird Option: 6:45 a.m. bus departure from North Western Station for insiders' tour of colorful South Water Market wholesale produce center for the Midwest, and Walker's wholesale fish market to see filleting, distribution and storage. Regular bus departure at 8:45 a.m. from North Western Station for Jewel Food Stores headquarters in Melrose Park for a behind-the-scenes inspection of a major food processing operation, Hillfarm Dairy and ice cream plant.

There will also be a special demonstration of meat cutting, grading and labeling. Luncheon at Hugo's in the Hyatt-Regency O'Hare. The afternoon will be devoted to an exclusive tour of the United Airlines Flight Kitchen (Schiller Park), a multi-million dollar catering operation providing in-flight food service on 747's and DC 10's. Included is an inspection of an airplane testing galley which simulates flight conditions of altitude, air pressure and turbulence to determine their effects on foods. Buses will return to North Western Station approximately 3:30 p.m. Early Birds—be sure to check box on order form.

Tour Five Tuesday, Nov. 9 ● Wednesday, Nov. 10 Depart promptly at 8:45 a.m.; arrive 9:45 at Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory in Batavia. An orientation and slide program will cover the research being done in high energy physics. A tour of the facility will follow; the cancer therapy center will be included in the tour. At 11:15, we will go to Caterpillar Tractor Company in Aurora, where we will have a plant orientation and film. Guides will join us for lunch and conduct small groups through the plant. Buses will return to North Western Station approximately 3:30 p.m.
